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## COVID-19 Policy

### How Will Camp Be The Same?

Many things remain the same! We will... learn, create, play, and make lasting memories with camp friends! How we do some of these things may look different, but we remain committed to providing an environment where all are invited to grow in the love of Christ.

### Group Based Programming

Campers, with their counselors, will be in two groups based on age. These groups will help limit possible COVID-19 transmission and exposure as well as assist with contact tracing if needed.

The two groups may interact with each other during special events, field trips other occurrences, but the Director will try to keep the groups separated as much as possible.

### Activities

Outdoor activities are encouraged and preferred during camp.

If outdoor activities are not possible due to inclement weather, counselors will be prepared to lead inside, socially distanced, in a designated area.

### Meals

Meals will be served 2 times a day (breakfast and lunch) via cafeteria style or prepacked kits. A snack will also be provided. This could be outside or during inclement weather inside.

### Face Coverings and General Health Safety Practices

All persons at camp will wear masks when indoors (with the exception of eating) and outdoors when not able to socially distance. If a camper is unable to wear a face covering for summer 2021, then we ask that you wait until next summer to register.

Campers are asked to leave 1-2 extra clean masks at camp in their designated basket.

We encourage campers to wear double layered fabric masks, and we ask campers to avoid single layer style face coverings. Please no neck gaiter style masks or bandanas used as masks. Basic cloth masks will be provided for anyone who needs them.

All persons at camp will practice CDC and ACA guidelines for hygiene and cleanliness.

Handwashing and hand sanitizer will be available and used frequently before and after meals, activities, and interactions.

All persons at camp will be screened daily for symptoms and temperatures will be checked.

Restrooms and shared use spaces will be cleaned and sanitized daily by volunteers and staff. If during a high use day, or high use week, these spaces may be cleaned more than once a day.

### Arriving at Camp

Only one parent/guardian may come inside to drop off the camper.

When signing in, a temperature check will be completed. If the camper's temperature is 100.4 or above, the camper will not be allowed to attend camp until they are fever free for 24 hours, without the use of fever reducing medication.

The parent/guardian may also be required to answer questions regarding COVID-19 exposure when dropping the camper off.

### **Departing Camp**

Campers will be packed and ready for pick up at beginning at 3:45pm.

One Parent/Guardian may come inside to sign-out the camper.

### **Camp Attendance**

Campers will be unable to attend camp if any of the below statements are true:

- The camper has tested positive for COVID-19.

- Someone in the camper's household has tested positive for COVID-19.

- The camper has been exposed to someone that tested positive in the last 14 days.

- The camper is feeling sick with flu-like symptoms.

- The camper has a fever of 100.4 or above.

### **What If Someone Develops COVID-19 Symptoms?**

Any camper, staff, or volunteer who is showing COVID-19 symptoms will be moved to an isolated room for comfort and monitoring.

The symptomatic camper will leave the camp as soon as possible.

The Director and support staff will call all parents/guardians of campers needing to leave and arrange pick-up times.

If, during the same week, another camper, volunteer, or staff member shows COVID-19 symptoms, all remaining campers and volunteers will be sent home. The Director with the help of support staff will call all parents/guardians of campers needing to leave and arrange pick-up times.

**Attention parents/guardians:** With this possibility of having to send campers home in the middle of the day, it is imperative that you provide us with a reachable contact person who will be available at any point of the camper's day for pick up. We know many parents/guardians may be at work when their camper is at camp. If you will not be available for pick-up during the week of camp, you must provide us with an emergency contact person who will be available to come get your camper.

### **Returning to Camp**

Any camper, staff or volunteer that was exposed and unable to attend camp, may return to camp after their designated quarantine/isolation time. This time is based off the current guidelines from the Pennsylvania Department of Health at that time. The Director will be in contact to confirm that day the camper may return to camp.

### **COVID-19 Cancellation Policy**

If prior to camp a camper is unable to attend their week of camp due to exposure to COVID-19 or being actively positive with COVID-19, a full refund will be issued or registration fees can be transferred to a later week of camp. Documentation may be required.

If campers need to be sent home due to a possible COVID-19 exposure during their week of camp, 50% of the camp fee will be refunded. Documentation may be required.

For cancellation reasons outside of COVID-19, our traditional Cancellation Policy will be in practice.
